#### 3.1 Administrators' Reports:

#### Mr. Dodge, HS Principal

Archery equipment is arriving! — Bows are ideal for all students to draw back. Students in grades 5-8 will have the opportunity to participate in archery club this first year. Archery will also be an activity in physical education. Middle School Grant — NYSED contacted Mr. Dodge and asked him to participate in MS Leadership Grant. Mr. Dodge has accepted the invitation and there will be more information to come.

Staff vs Trooper Basketball Game – A tentative date has been set for November 17, 2017. Mr. Dodge will continue working to set up this fundraiser activity. Summer Work & Gap Analysis – Mr. Dodge is working with BOCES staff specialists to conduct a gap analysis of NYS Test results. The outcome is to help teachers understand where the gaps in learning exist and adapt their instruction to meet these gaps. This work will be done across grades 3-12.

### Mrs. Aylor, Elementary Principal

3 PK State Conference – Mrs. Reed and Mrs. Aylor attended the NYSED Conference in Syracuse. The conference shared specific strategies and expectations for implementing the grant. Goals of the 3 year old pre-k program are to: identify and practice the social, emotional skills needed for success in school, oral language development and purposeful play. Summer Professional Development – Since summer started we have had 35 teachers in for professional development and recorded over 690 hours of professional development thus far.

#### Betsy Hardy, Director of Technology

Smart Schools Bond Act – Mrs. Hardy reviewed all of the equipment that will be ordered with the Smart Schools money.

Meeting with C-R Admin. and IT – The administrative/IT team met with the Fillmore administrative / IT team for two hours to share their experience rolling out their 1:1 program a few years ago. It was a very positive and informative experience.

Welcome new administrators – Betsy has been working with teachers already this summer. Around 20 teachers attended technology camp and were excited to work with new equipment like the 3D cart.

State Aid Review by Management Advisory Group – **Dr. Root contacted the**Management Advisory Group to have them come in to review STAC aid,
transportation aid and foster billings. In the past month, the district has
hired a new Business Manager and Director of Special Education. This is an
opportune time to bring in a company to review our books and let us know if
we are maximizing our state aid in these areas.

BOND RESOLUTION DATED JULY 26, 2017, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$190,000.00 BY THE FILLMORE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, ALLEGANY COUNTY, NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) 2017 BLUE BIRD VISION MODEL NO. BBCV3011 SIXTY-FIVE (65) PASSENGER DIESEL SCHOOL BUS, ONE (1) 2017 MICROBIRD MODEL NO. G5 THIRTY (30) PASSENGER DIESEL SCHOOL BUS AND ONE (1) 2017 DODGE GRAND CARAVAN SE MODEL NO. RTKH53 SIX (6) PASSENGER MINIVAN SCHOOL BUS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Fillmore Central School District, Allegany County, New York, by resolution duly adopted by the Board of Education on March 16, 2017 and approved by the voters of the Fillmore Central School District on May 16, 2017, authorizing the purchase of One (1) 2017 Blue Bird Vision Model No. BBCV3011 Sixty-Five (65) Passenger Diesel School Bus, One (1) 2017 Microbird Model No. G5 Thirty Passenger Diesel School Bus, and One (1) 2017 Dodge Grand Caravan SE Model No. RTKH53 Six (6) Passenger Minivan School Bus, said buses to be purchased at a total not to exceed \$190,000, and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of said buses,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The purchase of One (1) 2017 Blue Bird Vision Model No. BBCV3011 Sixty-Five (65) Passenger Diesel School Bus, One (1) 2017 Microbird Model No. G5 Thirty Passenger Diesel School Bus, and One (1) 2017 Dodge Grand Caravan SE Model No. RTKH53 Six (6) Passenger Minivan School Bus, is hereby authorized at a maximum cost of \$190,000.00.
- 2. The plan for the financing of said buses is by the payment of \$369.19 from current budget appropriations, bus number 111 trade-in allowance of \$2,500.00, and the issuance of \$181,000.00 serial bonds of said School District, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, which bonds are hereby authorized therefore; further details pertaining to said bonds, if necessary, may be prescribed in another resolution or resolutions of this board.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of bonds herein authorized, including renewals of said notes, is hereby delegated to the President of said Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer. Said notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said President, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.
- 4. It is hereby determined that the period of the probable usefulness of the aforesaid object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision 29 of paragraph A of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and the said bonds will mature over a period not in excess of five years.
  - 5. The faith and credit of said Fillmore Central School District, Allegany County, New York

are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively becomes due and payable.

- 6. The bonds hereby authorized are declared to be "exempt bonds" under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 inasmuch as the Fillmore Central School District will not issue more than \$10,000,000.00 of bonds during the year of issue.
- 7. The validity of such bonds or notes or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds may be contested only if:
- i. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the municipality, school district or district corporation is not authorized to expend money, or
- ii. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution or summary thereof, or certificate, as the case may be, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or
  - iii. Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.
