BOND RESOLUTION DATED AUGUST 31st, 2016, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$337,000.00 BY THE FILLMORE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, ALLEGANY COUNTY, NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) 2017 BLUE BIRD MODEL T3FE 3406 SIXTY-SIX (66) PASSENGER DIESEL SCHOOL BUS, ONE (1) 2017 BLUE BIRD VISION MODEL BBCV 3011 SIXTY-SIX (66) PASSENGER DIESEL SCHOOL BUS, ONE (1) 2017 CHEVROLET MODEL CG33803 THIRTY PASSENGER DIESEL SCHOOL BUS AND ONE (1) 2017 CHEVROLET SUBURBAN MODEL #CK15906 NINE (9) PASSENGER SCHOOL BUS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Fillmore Central School District, Allegany County, New York, by resolution duly adopted by the Board of Education on February 11, 2016 and approved by the voters of the Fillmore Central School District on May 17, 2016, authorizing the purchase of One (1) 2017 Blue Bird Model T3FE 3406 Sixty-Six (66) Passenger Diesel School Bus, One (1) 2017 Blue Bird Vision Model BBCV 3011 Sixty-Six Passenger Diesel School Bus, One (1) 2017 Chevrolet Model CG33803 Thirty Passenger Diesel School Bus, and One (1) 2017 Chevrolet Suburban Model #CK15906 Nine (9) Passenger School Bus, said buses to be purchased at a total price not to exceed \$337,000.00, and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of said buses,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The purchase of One (1) 2017 Blue Bird Model T3FE 3406 Sixty-Six (66) Passenger Diesel School Bus, One (1) 2017 Blue Bird Vision Model BBCV 3011 Sixty-Six Passenger Diesel School Bus, One (1) 2017 Chevrolet Model CG33803 Thirty Passenger Diesel School Bus, and One (1) 2017 Chevrolet Suburban Model #CK15906 Nine (9) Passenger School Bus is hereby authorized at a maximum cost of \$337.000.00.

2. The plan for the financing of said buses is by the payment of \$33.28 from current budget appropriations, bus number 106 trade-in allowance of \$1,750.00, bus number 112 trade-in allowance of \$3,500.00, bus number 118 trade-in allowance of \$6,000.00, and the issuance of \$<u>310,100.00</u> serial bonds of said School District, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, which bonds are hereby authorized therefore; further details pertaining to said bonds, if necessary, may be prescribed in another resolution or resolutions of this board.

3. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of bonds herein authorized, including renewals of said notes, is hereby delegated to the President of said Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer. Said notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said President, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

4. It is hereby determined that the period of the probable usefulness of the aforesaid

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object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision 29 of paragraph A of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and the said bonds will mature over a period not in excess of five years.

5. The faith and credit of said Fillmore Central School District, Allegany County, New York are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively becomes due and payable.

6. The bonds hereby authorized are declared to be "exempt bonds" under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 inasmuch as the Fillmore Central School District will not issue more than \$10,000,000.00 of bonds during the year of issue.

7. The validity of such bonds or notes or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds may be contested only if:

i. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the municipality, school district or district corporation is not authorized to expend money, or

ii. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution or summary thereof, or certificate, as the case may be, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or

iii. Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.
