Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Board President Parmenter.

1. PRELIMINARY MATTERS/PUBLIC COMMENT - NONE

2. PROGRAMS/PRESENTATIONS

- David V. DiTanna of Buffamante, Whipple, Buttafaro gave a presentation and provided a preliminary report regarding our recent external audit. The report was reviewed and deficiencies were explained as well as reporting where significant progress has been made. The audit covered all areas of finance including grants, and all fund accounts.
- Contractor Mark Eberts was present with Rod Drake from Clark Patterson Lee. Mr. Eberts shared his view on poured rubber surfaces used for school playgrounds. He spoke to the process of the construction and to the advantages. While no surface can guarantee no injuries, the surface he is proposing ranks extremely high for student safety. Mr. Drake affirmed Mr. Ebert's view of the proposed surface along with additional information including the possibility of adding color and pattern to the surface.
- Girls Basketball coach Tom Parks was present and spoke to the proposed makeup of the girls basketball teams this coming fall. Due to the number of girls that have shown interest in joining the team this year, he suggests two Modified teams, no JV team and one Varsity team. This will allow for the most participation and create a scenario for the possibility of a JV team next year.
- Athletic Director Jon Beardsley shared updated plans for the synthetic surfaced field. He
 reviewed the layout of lines for the baseball, softball and soccer fields along with
 explanation of where new lighting will be located, dugout construction and location and
 location of fencing both for field use and for pedestrian traffic. There was also discussion
 regarding better access to the fields for emergency vehicles in the event a serious injury
 occurs. Several samples of synthetic field turf with different lengths of the blade were provided
 and there was discussion on the type of in-fill that would be used.

3. DISCUSSION/WORK SESSION

- 3.1 Administrators' Reports
 - Dr. Butler shared that a total of 173 students received good behavior tickets and are eligible for prizes.

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- There are now 7 students that have been named as Soaring Eagles. This honor goes to students that have shown outstanding character.
- A schedule of upcoming awards assembly was shared.
- Mr. Dodge shared that he had attended a middle schools conference and found the information provided valuable.
- The new 7th grade social studies exam was discussed.
- The annual Open House was very well attended as usual.
- Student training as Safe School Ambassadors is scheduled for October 30 in the multipurpose room.
- On November 10 there will be a presentation by the organization "Missing and Exploited Children". The presentation will emphasize internet safety.
- Several drills including a lock out and lock down drill are scheduled for the week of October 27.

- 3.3 Superintendent's Report
 - Mr. Root reviewed several Capital Project updates. Roof project bids have begun to be accepted. We also discussed window replacements and details such as latch location, screens and energy efficiency. The new clock system was reviewed with an example of a replacement clock available for inspection. The clocks will be synchronized with the bell system and be updated by the atomic clock in Denver, CO.
 - FCS will employ two certified teachers through the Ameri-Corps program. Both teachers have shown enthusiasm and a desire to help students after school. The teachers are paid by Ameri-Corps and will be assigned to work at FCS.
 - Smart Snacks Standards and the effect on student Fundraisers were discussed.
 - Sectionals for soccer and volleyball are scheduled and will be played in the next week or so.
 - Progress regarding the development of a STEM classroom is good with excellent teacher participation working on building the program. There also has been good participation with Writers Workshop.
 - Open house was a great success and continues to be one of the premier events of the school year.

BOND RESOLUTION DATED OCTOBER 23, 2014, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$265,000.00 BY THE FILLMORE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, ALLEGANY COUNTY, NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE THE PURCHASE OF TWO (2) 2015 BLUE BIRD MODEL T3FE 3406 SIXTY-SIX (66) PASSENGER DIESEL SCHOOL BUSES AND ONE (1) 2015 SUBURBAN NINE (9) PASSENGER SCHOOL BUS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Fillmore Central School District, Allegany County, New York, by resolution duly adopted by the Board of Education on February 20, 2014 and approved by the voters of the Fillmore Central School District on May 20, 2014, authorizing the purchase of Two (2) 2015 Blue Bird Model T3FE 3406 Sixty-Six (66) Passenger Diesel School Buses and One (1) 2015 Suburban Nine (9) Passenger School Bus, said buses to be purchased at a total price not to exceed \$265,000.00, and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of said buses,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The purchase of Two (2) 2015 Blue Bird Model T3FE 3406 Sixty-Six (66) Passenger Diesel School Buses and One (1) 2015 Suburban Nine (9) Passenger School Bus is

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hereby authorized at a maximum cost of \$265.000.00.

- 2. The plan for the financing of said buses is by the payment of \$<u>19.85</u> from current budget appropriations, bus number 108 trade-in allowance of \$7,500.00, bus number 109 trade-in allowance of \$7,500.00 and the issuance of \$249,900.00 serial bonds of said School District, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, which bonds are hereby authorized therefore; further details pertaining to said bonds, if necessary, may be prescribed in another resolution or resolutions of this board.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of bonds herein authorized, including renewals of said notes, is hereby delegated to the President of said Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer. Said notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said President, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.
- 4. It is hereby determined that the period of the probable usefulness of the aforesaid object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision 29 of paragraph A of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and the said bonds will mature over a period not in excess of five years.
- 5. The faith and credit of said Fillmore Central School District, Allegany County, New York are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively becomes due and payable.
- 6. The bonds hereby authorized are declared to be "exempt bonds" under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 inasmuch as the Fillmore Central School District will not issue more than \$10,000,000.00 of bonds during the year of issue.
- 7. The validity of such bonds or notes or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds may be contested only if:

i. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the municipality, school district or district corporation is not authorized to expend money, or

ii. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution or summary thereof, or certificate, as the case may be, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or

iii. Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.
